Concept/ Project title: Fish Farming Diversification

BP Title and Host: Tubigon Mariculture Project, the Philippines (Fiscal Management and Investment Planning)

Duration of project: 2012 – 2017

Background: Pangkalpinang is located in Bangka Island of Bangka Belitung Province, with 156.982 registered inhabitants (2008). Most of them are coastal communities with low level of economic and education which lead them to do illegal mining activities that destroy the environmental and ecological of the coastal and marine ecosystem. Pangkalpinang is currently facing the conflict of interests between the fishermen and mining actors about the utilization of marine resources and coastal landscape.

There are several main challenges in Pangkalpinang among others low human resource quality, low income of fishermen, conflict of interest among mining actors, lack of government budget, the using of debt bondage and middlemen in the fish marketing, illegal, unreported, and unregulated fishing, offshore tin mining, lack of regulation of marine and coastal spatial, and no proper fishing equipment and infrastructures.

Purpose of the Concept/Project:

By 2013 the welfare (knowledge and income) of coastal communities and other fisheries actors increased, and marine and coastal ecosystem preserved.



This project is co-funded by the European Union. A Project implemented by the consortium: Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung e.V., Thailand Environment Institute (TEI), Local Government Development Foundation Inc. (LOGODEF), United Cities and Local Governments for Asia and Pacific (UCLG-ASPAC), Association of Indonesian Regency Governments (APKASI), Association of Cities of Vietnam (ACVN), and National League of Communes/Sangkats of the Kingdom of Cambodia (NLC/S).

Key result:

- 60% of coastal communities' income increased;
- 60% of fishermen's skills and knowledge increased in the use of GPS, the cold chain techniques, sea catches management, on boat fish catching techniques, fishery agribusiness, fish cultivation and post harvest techniques, and the fish feed making process;
- 66 women in the pilot areas (one woman per household) trained on the fishery marketing, partnership between fishermen groups and the financial institutions/bank;
- fishery facilities and infrastructures established;
- marine spatial regulation established.

Main activities:

There are 7 main activities in the concept design, namely knowledge improvement, the capital system and fishery business development, the marketing system development, the fish cultivation development, the fishing facilities and infrastructure development, the institutional strengthening, and the preservation of marine and coastal ecosystem.

Duration: 2011 – 2013

Total Budget: IDR. 35.616.020.000 (EUR 2.860.724)
